The recipient of three Pushcart prizes and fellowships from the Lannan Foundation, NEA, NYPL, FAWC, and Stanford, her work appears in *Slate*, *The Threepenny Review*, and *Best American Poetry*. She directs the MFA program at The University of Massachusetts-Boston and 24PearlStreet, the Fine Arts Work Center online.

Askold Melnyczuk is founding editor of *AGNI*, professor of creative writing at The University of Massachusetts-Boston, and a member of the core fiction faculty of the graduate Bennington Writing Seminars. His third novel, *The House of Widows* (Graywolf Press), won the

Editor's Choice Award from the American Library Association as one of the outstanding books of 2008. His second novel, *Ambassador of the Dead* (Counterpoint, 2001) was called "exquisite, original" by *The Washington Post*, and his first, *What Is Told* (Faber and Faber), was a *New York Times* Notable Book for 1994.
